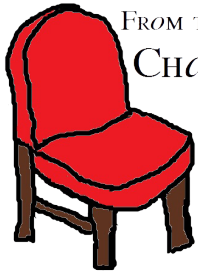
Wonder Workshop \$1199.70

Celebrating Interaction Through Music \$500

Grindstone Elementary

This project invites young children and children with special needs to interact with both students and adults through motivating musical activities. The students will interact vocally and physically through musical instruments and puppets.

Bee Smart \$225
