Bicycles and a rain barrel help raise funds for Auction


A pair of bicycles, a custom-designed rain barrel and plenty of tickets to Cleveland sports teams, among a host of other items, helped raise funds to support the programs of The Education Foundation at its 17th annual auction on March 9.

The auction at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Middleburg Heights attracted more than 200 guests and raised approximately \$54,000 for Enrichment Grants and other programs of The Education Foundation.

The auction offered more than 75 live and silent auction items. There were themed gift baskets, Indians and Cavs tickets, a stay at a vacation home on Cape Cod and another stay at a condo in Las Vegas.

Some of the auction items were unique. Among the more popular offerings were two his and hers bikes

donated by Berea City School District directors. Students in the Berea-Midpark High School AP Environmental Class and members of the Environmental Club offered a rain barrel decorated with the Titans logo.



Local artists featured their work as well. There were original creations by Frederick C. Graff, Tony Kleem and Mel Grunau. Allen Kradlak donated a handcrafted ceramic vase and there was handcrafted furniture by Terry Dobberstein.

Auction Chair Susan Hans, who also is chair of the Board of Trustees, said the Auction Committee keeps the event fresh each year. "They have really good ideas," Hans said. She also praised the Crowne Plaza, where the Auction will return in 2018. "We like to keep the auction in the district," she said. "And they (the hotel) are easy to work with."

Hans said the committee was especially pleased that quite a few newcomers attended the auction this year. "We were happy to see familiar faces from the school district but it was great to see so many new guests," Hans said.

Makerspace

It is an informal, project-driven, self-directed learning workspace that promotes tinkering, thinking outside the box, and collaboration. This grant will fund materials for the Makerspace project, which is available to every BMHS student.

One Book, One School

STEM Challenges for Kindergarten

Cassandra Dracup, Berea-Midpark High School \$600 This PD grant will provide funds to purchase two new digital cameras for a BMHS photography class, which gives students a strong foundation in photographic principles using film and darkroom equipment, digital cameras, lighting equipment, and Photoshop to create original artwork.

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination)

Kelly Baumgartner, Berea-Midpark High School \$500 For a variety of reasons, some students do not consider a college education a possibility. AVID's goal is to encourage these students to enroll in college after high school graduation or after military service. The grant will help to fund the end of the year banquet and tutors.
