
New Fall fundraiser puts Berea City Schools in the limelight

STEM Bins

Gina Steele, Big Creek Elementary \$350 This grant will fund STEM Bins to be used in Mrs. Steele's first grade classroom and shared throughout the grade level. STEM Bins are boxes filled with a manipulatives such as LEGO bricks, pattern blocks, Dixie cups, toothpicks and play dough, Popsicle sticks with Velcro, etc. Students will be able to use STEM Bins individually or in groups for problem solving activities.

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination)

under-served populations, preparing them for college success.Students are expected to maintain enrollment in a rigorous
course load that includes higher level classes such as Honors,
Advanced Placement, and College Credit Plus. This grant will

Emily Hall & Andrea Bockmore, J&G Snow School \$600 Snow School is located on the Ohio Guidestone campus and staffed by Berea City School District. This grant will fund an interactive learning program that encourages creativity and can be used by students in all grade levels. Osmo is facilitated through the use of an iPad and is designed with reflective artificial intelligence, a groundbreaking technology that bridges the real and digital realms. Students will strengthen their academic skills by utilizing a hands-on interactive program that will build upon their math, critical thinking, reading, and vocabulary skills. They will be provided the opportunity to engage in 21st century learning while closing learning gaps.

Camp Mi-Bro-Be

Leonard Muni, Berea-Midpark Middle School \$1000 Camp Mi-Bro-Be is a residential outdoor education program for BCSD 6th graders. Over 120 high school students serve as volunteer counselors for the four weeks of camp. This grant will fund the purchase of hats and T-shirts for the counselors. Having a staff uniform makes the counselors more visible to campers. It helps them bond as a group and be more effective in their role. The shirts and hats are also a token of appreciation for these student volunteers.

New Scholarship available for students entering the medical field

The DiFrancesco Family Medical Studies Scholarship was established this year in memory of Cynthia M. DiFrancesco, 1955-2015. Mrs. DiFrancesco graduated from the Cuyahoga Community College and Ashland University Schools of Nursing and had a career as a Cleveland Clinic Foundation Registered Nurse. She was a "Berea Mom" and a dedicated supporter of the Berea City School District.

Beginning next school year, this scholarship will be available to Berea-Midpark High School graduating seniors who plan to attend a college or university to pursue studies in the field of medicine. Priority will be given to students interested in a nursing career.


