On March 5th, The Education Foundation's Auction Committee presented their 20th annual fundraising event to support students in the Berea City School District and successfully raised over \$43,000 in one evening.

Auctioneer Bob Hale kept over 200 guests bidding on live auction items including a Columbia Hills golf outing, a Baldwin Wallace University tuition voucher, and getaways to Las Vegas, Cape Cod, and Gervasi Vineyard in Canton. Meanwhile, Tavolo 72 Ristorante chefs created custom pasta dishes for each attendee. Between dinner, drinks and bidding, participants tried their luck at the wine pull, silent auctions, gift card ping-pong pick, and \$250 end-of-evening raffle drawing.

Art is always a highlight of the Annual Auction. This year's event featured original and custom

paintings by Joan Satow, Mel Grunau, Lauren Lloyd, Candace Brown, Clarice Cole Wallace, and Anthony Kleem. Additionally, those interested in creating their own art could bid on an in-home Paint n' Sip experience for six donated by Andrea McGhee or on Kim Dettmer's Art Basket.

One of this year's most exciting items was a personalized singing telegram to be performed by members of the Berea Midpark High show choir, *Center Stage*. Four student performers, organized by Sarah Novak, serenaded the crowd and encouraged bidding with their harmonized humor.

Rhoda Rosen is a former library staff member of Big Creek Elementary, longtime host of the BCSD Community of Learning, and even occasional host of the Foundation's Annual Auction. She was Dottie's best friend and together they were quite the team!

Dottie Bowers ran the Fairwood Elementary library for many years. After retirement, Dottie worked for a bookstore where she dressed in costume, had a "magic bag" of books to read to customers, and was known as "The Book Lady." Both Dottie and Rhoda have been inducted into Berea City School District's Alumni Hall of Fame.

BCSD preschool and elementary library staff members are eligible to receive funding from this grant, which will be made available on the Foundation website when there is more clarity about this fall's school opening and format.

Enrichment Grant Funds to Support Summer Literacy

In response to the Covid pandemic and resulting school closures, Foundation trustees consulted with BCSD administrators on how Enrichment Grant funds could be used to best serve the District overall. Superintendent Tracy Wheeler proposed that a summer literacy program for students in kindergarten through third grade would provide the greatest impact on student learning. As Wheeler explained, "research shows that students have a better chance for success in school and beyond when their families actively participate in their learning and when the students are encouraged to read at least one hour every day."

Foundation trustee and former BCSD librarian Laurie Scriven supported the District's proposal. She said, "reading provides the opportunity to travel beyond the walls of our own homes by engaging with people and places outside our spheres. During this time of limited access to public libraries, we are especially grateful to be able to provide books for the K-3 students."

Federal Title 1 funding was available to cover the cost of Scholastic summer book packs for K-3 Brookview and Brook Park Memorial students. The Education Foundation provided approximately \$23,000 to extend the summer literacy program to K-3 students in Grindstone and Big Creek Elementaries. Summer book pack distribution is being organized by building principals. Parents should expect email communication about book packs soon.

While this program utilized the majority of the Foundation's Enrichment Grant funding, there are still grant monies for 2020-2021 school year programs. Donor-directed grant funds and staff-funded Payroll Deduction Grants were not used for book packs. Applications for these types of grants will be made available when there is more clarity about the plans and protocol for the upcoming school year.
